

Sunshine Beach State School Learner Dress Code

Uniform Expectation	Learners and Parents are	Consequences
 The Sunshine Beach State School uniform is a unisex uniform consisting of a royal blue shirt and shorts. The shirt has a collar and sleeves to protect learners from the sun. The school emblem of the sun is printed in white on the right side of the shirt. Underneath this is the school logo a 'Good Place to be'. The unisex shorts have a white school logo printed on the lower left leg. Royal blue jackets and jumpers are available in two styles (vest and zip up fleecy lined jacket) with the sun logo. Plain navy tights may be worn under shorts in cooler weather. Plain royal blue track pants are an option to suit the weather. A sports shirt in sports house colours is worn for athletics and school sporting events and on timetabled class PE days. Learners in the final year of school may wear their senior school shirt. 	Sunshine Beach State School is a uniform school. This is endorsed by the P&C. Sunshine Beach State School is a sun safe school. All learners from Prep to Year 6 are required to wear the standard uniform daily. To represent the school on excursions, interschool sport and in the media etc. all learners are to wear the appropriate Sunshine uniform.	Learners wearing inappropriate clothing or apparel will be asked to dress appropriately and when appropriate to remove the non-uniform item. Learners not wearing the school uniform will be ineligible to represent the school away from school or appear in any promotional photos. If learners are repeatedly out of uniform, parents or caregivers will be notified of school expectations.
Hat		
 Learners are required to have a royal blue brimmed hat at school ready to wear every day. Prep learners wear a yellow brimmed hat. 	Wearing a hat will enable learners to participate safely in outdoor lessons, activities, sports and play. Non –wearing of a hat is 'likely to result in a risk to the health of the student'. Sunshine Beach follows the Sun State guidelines of the Queensland Cancer Society.	A learner not wearing a hat or an appropriate hat will not be permitted to play outdoors. During play times the learner will be required to remain in the undercover areas.

Hair

Jewellery		
 Students may wear a watch and small plain sleepers or stud earrings. A student may wear a medical bracelet if required. 	Other jewellery may be 'unsafe for student or others', as they could become caught in play equipment or could come into contact with another student causing injury. Necklaces, bracelets and bike / house keys on neck chains are not appropriate.	A student wearing other jewellery will be asked to remove the item and if necessary take it to the office for safe keeping for the remainder of the day.
Make Up and Nail Polish		
Make up is not part of the school uniform.	All forms of make up including mascara, eye liner/shadow and lipstick are inappropriate for school. Clear medicated lip balm may be worn if required.
