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Introduction

A selection process will determine which students will assume formal leadership roles.

The elected students will be guided and supported by the staff in order to perform their duties with growing confidence and independence. As such, the students are expected to be committed to their leadership positions.

We encourage all Year Six students to consider this opportunity as an invaluable and rewarding experience.

Selection Process for Student Leaders

The following positions will be selected based on the processes described below:

- School Leaders
- House Leaders
- Cultural Leaders
- Environmental Leaders

Selection Process:

- 1. Leadership session provided for students.
- 2. Leadership Application Booklets distributed to interested students.
- 3. Self-nominating students submit a handwritten application to their class teacher by due date: Friday 27 October.
- 4. Short-listing of candidates by panel.
- 5. All short-listed candidates deliver speeches at a small assembly.
- 6. Panel interview Student Leader candidates.
- 7. Student Leadership positions announced.
- 8. In Term 1 2024, Student Leaders will be presented with their badges at a special Assembly / Leadership Investiture.
 - Please note that due dates will be stringently enforced.
 Written Applications will <u>not</u> be accepted after the due date.
 Written Applications may be completed with Parent/Carer assistance but must be handwritten by the applicant. One page only.
 - Successful students will be offered one leadership position only. Students will be notified of their selection in their nominated leadership positions in Term 4, Week 9-10.
 - <u>Peer Leaders</u> will be selected based on their written application.

Parents / Carers Information

Dear Parents/Carers,

Nominations are being called for School Leadership positions of School Leaders, Sports Leaders, Cultural Leaders and Environmental Leaders at Sunshine Beach State School for 2024.

We believe that all Year 6 students have a leadership role in the school and we want our elected leaders to be students who have the necessary qualities for them to carry out their special responsibilities. Therefore, all Year 5 students have been informed of the process and requirements of school leadership positions.

If your child is considering nominating, we request your assistance by discussing the responsibilities of the position with your son/daughter so that he/she fully understands the implications of being a School Leader. It may also be helpful to have conversations with your son/daughter about the processes involved in selecting leaders. As you can probably appreciate, it is often very difficult to make the final decisions, especially when there are many suitable candidates, and unfortunately, there are usually more applicants than positions available. This, of course, means that some students will miss out on being offered a leadership position, and, understandably, this may lead to disappointment.

We would ask that those students who do miss out on selection be accepting of the final decisions, and encourage them to make the most of other leadership opportunities that will be available to them in 2023, as their input and contributions as Year 6 Leaders will certainly be highly valued.

We also ask that you take careful note of the timelines associated with the leadership process. These dates are essential for the process to run effectively and for students to be considered for their nominated positions.
